

**TOWN OF MARSHFIELD
FEBRUARY MONTHLY MEETING**

February 9, 2026
Marshfield Town Hall
6:30 p.m.

Town Officials present: Chairman John Bord, Supervisors Ken Kraus and Joe Rappl, Treasurer Cathy Seibel, and Clerk Marlene J. Sippel. From the Public: Marc Pasineau, Zoning Administrator, Peter Keifenheim, and Mike Torgerud.

John Bord called the meeting to order leading the Pledge of Allegiance. Public notices were posted at the designated sites and the news media was notified. The agenda was approved.

Consent Agenda (Items on the Consent Agenda are routine in nature and require one motion to approve all items listed. Prior to voting on the Consent Agenda, items on the Consent Agenda may be removed at the request of any Supervisor and addressed immediately following the motion to approve the other items on the Consent Agenda)

2. Approve Treasurer’s Report – January 31, 2026--The Treasurer’s report showed the following balances ending January 31, 2026:

Motion Kraus/Rappl to approve Consent Agenda. Motion carried 3-0.

Items Removed from Consent Agenda: None.

Specific Matters for Discussion and/or Possible Action by Town Board:

1. Jim Sippel, Candidate for County Board Supervisor – District 12—Jim discussed his views on the proposed criminal justice center for Fond du Lac County. A town hall meeting will be held between the candidates, Jim Sippel and Dennis Stenz, on March 15 at 1:30 p.m. at the Mt. Calvary Hall (formerly known as Maximillian’s), 155 Fond du Lac Street, Mt. Calvary.
2. Roads
 - a. Walnut—Bids will be out on February 12th. Bid opening will be March 5th at 11 a.m.
 - b. Other—The State announced a Local Small Structures Improvement Program (LSSIP) Application. The Town has a structure located on Valley Road in poor condition. Motion Kraus/Rappl to hire someone to fill out the paperwork for the grant for an amount of not to exceed \$1,000. Motion carried 3-0.
3. Equipment—Pomp’s Tire in Green Bay is sending the wheel (rim) from the Oshkosh plow truck down to their store in Quincy, IL. They will transport it over to a Machine Shop to have a new one made. The sealing edge where the bead seats and seals are worn. The plow edge on the wheel wing is worn on the Oshkosh.
4. WTA Meetings

- a. Quarterly – March 5, 2026 at FDL Co. Highway Dept. – John and Joe will attend
5. Storage Containers – Fee Schedule—falls under “detached accessory structures”.
6. Emergency Operations Plan –Tabled until March
7. Appoint Replacement for Ken Kraus, former Town Board Ambulance Board Representative— Motion Bord/Kraus to appoint Joe Rappl as the Town Board’s representative to the Ambulance Board. Motion carried 3-0.
8. Zoning Ordinance
 - a. State of Wisconsin – Act 68 – Required Local Land Division Ordinance Amendment (Cedar Corp)—No action needed as the Town of Marshfield falls under Fond du Lac County Subdivision Ordinance.
 - b. Data Centers—John will contact Attorney Ackerman about a moratorium
9. Transportation Resolution—Motion Kraus/Rappl to approve Resolution 2023-002, Resolution Supporting a Comprehensive and Sustainable Transportation Funding Solution. Motion carried 3-0.

Pay Bills: Motion Kraus/Rappl to approve the expenditures as presented. Motion carried 3-0.

Public Comments: Mike Torgerud asked if he could review the plans for Walnut Road. Some additional information was given to Mike for the Ambulance Board. Peter Keifenheim was asking if there was a way to identify a property that does not have a fire number. Questions were asked on the Town’s delegation application for DSPS.

Reports of Town Officers:

John plans on attending the Road School which WTA is holding again in April. Joe and John will be attending the Asphalt Pavement Seminar on March 12th. The proposed ATV Routes which were submitted to the County last month, were approved. Ken completed the curbside pickup report for the Clerk. Marc verified the number of homes which can be built in a year. Joe commented on the meeting that was held in Plymouth on the Ozaukee County Distribution Interconnection Project. Tax collection season is completed. Audit report for Rural Insurance is completed.

There being no further business, motion Kraus/Rappl to adjourn. The meeting adjourned at 8:52 p.m.
