Recycle Right--Every time you Recycle, it makes a difference.

PAPER

Accept:

**Cardboard & Paperboard (Food Boxes)
Newspapers & Inserts
Office & School Paper
Envelopes, Junk Mail & Catalogs
Milk, Juice & Soup Cartons**

Do NOT Accept:

**No Paper Cups
No Shredded Paper
No Tissue Paper
No Pet Food Bags**

Guidelines:

**Cut Boxes to no larger than 2'x 2'
Take confidential papers to shred
events for shredding and recycling.**

PLASTIC

Accept:

**All Plastic # 1 – 7
Household Bottles, Jars & Jug
Dairy Containers & Lids
Produce, Bakery & Deli Containers**

Do NOT Accept:

**No Plastic Cups & Lids
No Plastic Bags, Wraps & Films
No Motor Oil Bottles
No Styrofoam**

Guidelines:

**Empty, rinse and replace
caps & lids**

METAL & GLASS

Accept:

**Aluminum Bottles & Cans
Glass Food & Beverage
Bottles & Jars**

Do NOT Accept:

**No Aluminum Pans or Foil
No Mirrors
No Window Glass
No Ceramics & China
No Drinking Glassware**

Guidelines:

Empty & Rinse

When in doubt, throw your item in the garbage.

❖ Please be sure to rinse all plastic and metal containers to remove residue.

Some stuff doesn't belong in recycling.

Plastic Bags – Plastic bags, film and wrap are #1 contaminants. Keep recyclables loose and take plastic bags back to store drop-offs.

Sharps—Needles, lancets and syringes are #1 safety concern for the Recycling facility sorting staff. Do not throw sharps in recycling or trash. Visit: dnr.wi.gov and search “Sharp Collections”

Yuck—Liquids, food and trash can contaminate good recyclables. Empty & rinse containers; compost food scrapes and throw trash in the garbage.

Tanglers—Cords, chains and wires wrap around sorting equipment creating unnecessary maintenance at the Recycling Facility. Take these items to e-waste collectors or scrap metal dealers.

Gift Wrap—Paper wrapping is recyclable. Gift wraps made from aluminum foil and film plastic are not. Neither are ribbons, bows and tissue paper.

We E-Cycle Electronics – PLEASE ASK CUSTODIAN FOR ASSISTANCE

- Consumer Computers (desktops, laptops, netbooks, e-readers and tablets)
- Consumer Printers (desktop-style printers, printer-fax-copier-scanner combinations, Fax Machines and 3-D printers)
- Consumer video display devices (TVs and computer monitors)
- Computer peripherals (mice, keyboards, scanners, etc.)
- Fax machines
- DVD players, VCR's, DVR's and other video players
- Cell Phones
- Video Game consoles, hand-held video games and battery-powered accessories

We are not responsible for data containing devices.

- ❖ A separate bin located next to the recyclable bins is for the **Tin Cans** – Food containers only
- ❖ Aluminum Cans should also be separated from the rest of the recyclables
- ❖ Oil Filters and Aerosol cans can be placed in the large bin for scrap metal
- ❖ Only put metal in the large dumpster, as the Town is charged for concrete or other materials put in there. Remove as much plastic as possible from items and remove cloth from chairs. Refrigerators/air conditioners/freezers with freon line intact should be put here
- ❖ All batteries (small and large) are accepted
- ❖ Clean brush (tree branches, shrubbery, etc.) should be taken to the designated area
- ❖ Yard waste (lawn clippings, leaves, etc.) should be taken to the designated area
- ❖ Waste oil is **NOT** accepted at the center —Stenz Auto Body or Meinert Tractor Repair will take it
- ❖ Tires are **NOT** accepted. Schrage Bros will accept them for a fee
- ❖ Please check the link to the recycling news DNR on the Town's website for additional information.
- ❖ If you prefer not to utilize the recycling center, you can contract for curb side pickup by contacting Waste Management— 920-923-8820 or 1-888-960-0008
- ❖ **CONSTRUCTION DEBRIS** – Is not accepted. Property owners are required to provide their own dumpster
